The Approval Committee (AC) of the BOI on 13th August okayed 'SEZ' status for the Allama Iqbal Industrial City (AIIC), Faisalabad, and referred the applications of JW SEZ and Dhabeji SEZ for consideration of the Board of Approvals. The AC also gave a goahead to the constitution of SEZ committees of AIIC, Bostan and Hub SEZs, allowing thereby the sale of plots.

The plan for agriculture modernization will focus on locust control; germ plasma resource exchange; exchange of agriculture experts; pest and disease control satellite station; fisheries, aqua-culture and shrimp farming; and postharvest food processing technologies.

China, Pakistan's universities to promote cooperation in textile under CPEC

According to the agreement jointly signed by Shanghai University of Engineering Science (SUES), China and National Textile University (NTU), Pakistan in May, the two universities are to promote bilateral exchanges and cooperation in teaching, scientific research, academic conferences, seminars, symposiums, long-term and short-term student exchange programmes, mutual recognition agreement (MRA) for GPA, double major programmes, summer exchange programmes and industry-university collaborations (IUCs), so as to build a demonstration platform for textile engineering technology exchange between both universities.

Foreign investment up by 88pc

Pakistan has seen an 88% increase in foreign direct investment (FDI), from \$1.36b in 2019 to \$2.56b in 2020, according to the data released by the State Bank. This is primarily because China is investing in the telecommunication and power sector via the CPEC programme.
