CPEC SEZs: gearing up

Since the last few months, the SEZs are back in business, with significant developments.

A total of nine SEZs are planned under CPEC, including the 03 priority SEZs in Sindh, Punjab and Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa: Dhabeji SEZ, Allama Igbal Industrial City, and Rashakai Economic Zone. Punjab is developing the 3,000-acre Allama Iqbal **Industrial City** through the government-owned Faisalabad Industrial Estate Development and Management Company.

K-P has partnered with a Chinese state-owned developer. China Road and Bridge Corporation, for developing the Rashakai Economic Zone.

For **Dhabeji**, **Sindh** is undertaking a competitive procurement under its publicprivate partnership law.

The cross border fiber optic cable is a 820-kilometer-long fiber optic cable project at a cost of \$46 million, which stretches from China's western Xinjiang region, enters Pakistan through the Khunjerab border, and then travels through GB to Islamabad and Rawalpindi.
